

Arapahoe Little League Code of Conduct

The object of Arapahoe Little League (A.L.L.) shall be to reinforce by example the ideals of good sportsmanship, honesty, loyalty, courage and respect for authority in the children of the community, so that they may be well adjusted, stronger, and happier children and will grow to be good, decent, healthy, and trustworthy citizens. Promoting what is “for the good of youth” is the guiding principle of the League’s Program.

Its benefits are to be derived from the Arapahoe Little League Program, the highest standards of ethics and sportsmanship must be maintained. The ethics and sportsmanship of players, managers, coaches, officials, parents, and any other person associated with A.L.L. must be exemplary and beyond reproach. Everyone participating must conduct themselves so as to be a credit to athletics and A.L.L., keeping the objectives of the league in mind at all times.

The A.L.L.’s Code of Conduct shall apply to all members and be strictly enforced by the Board of directors of the Arapahoe Little League. The following points shall make up the Code of conduct, in addition to the “Little League Official Regulations and Playing Rules”, as well as generally accepted good sportsmanship are to be followed at all times.

Any violation of the following before, during, or after the game shall result in ejection, probation, suspension, or expulsion.

The points that make up the Arapahoe Little League Code of Conduct are as follows:

- 1. Language** – Any use of foul or obscene language or actions directed to a player, manager, coach, fan or official before, after, or during any event.
- 2. Fighting** – Any type of physical contact that occurs outside the normal player contact by anyone.
- 3. Tobacco and Alcohol** – The use of tobacco and alcoholic beverages in any form is prohibited on any baseball field, benches, dugouts, and community area of A.L.L. property. Since this is a program for the youth, alcoholic beverages will not be allowed at any Arapahoe Little League Functions.

Disciplinary Actions – After being ejected from a game, a player, manager or coach will automatically be required to sit out the next game. He/She will also meet a disciplinary board before being allowed to participate in any future games. The disciplinary board and all parties involved must meet within 72 hours after the incident/ejection. A second offence may be grounds for expulsion from the league for the remainder of the season.

One probation, suspension or expulsion causes a manager or coach to be ineligible for post-season tournament play. More than one probation, suspension or expulsion causes a player or fan to be ineligible for post-season tournament play.
